July 14-18 Verse 7: bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

July 21-25 Verse 8: Love never fails; but if there are gifts of prophecy, they will be done away; if there are tongues, they will cease; if there is knowledge, it will be done away.

July 28 - August 1 Verse 9: For we know in part and we prophesy in part;

August 4-8 Verse 10: but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away.

August 11-15 Verse 11: When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things.

August 18-22 Verse 12: For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known.

August 25-29 Verse 13: But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.
